#### **MANAGEMENT**

**TEAM** 

The day-to-day running of Politeknik Shah Alam is carried out through the management team and a set-up of committees. While the management team of Politeknik Shah Alam, comprising the Principal and the Heads of Departments, is the highest decision-making body at the polytechnic level, the set-up of various committees facilitates inter-department co-operation and the task of working towards a common goal. The stakeholder of this educational venture is the Technical Education Department (TED), in particular, the Polytechnic Management Division of the Ministry of Education.

#### **PRINCIPAL**

The principal is the person at the helm of Politeknik Shah Alam. He is responsible for managing his team and available resources resulting in the successful realisation of the polytechnic's vision and mission.

Haji Yusoff bin Harun AMN, the first principal of PSA, holds a Civil Engineering Degree from the UK, a Masters Degree in Technical Education from USA and a Diploma in Management from the Malaysian Institute of Management (MIM). He has been involved in the field of technical education for the last 26 years. He was the Deputy Director of the Planning and Research Division in TED, Ministry of Education prior to his present appointment.

CIVIL engineering

department

The vision of the Civil Engineering Department of PSA is to work closely with industries to develop and train an internationally competitive workforce. This is very timely as the present slow-down in the domestic economy would probably see construction industries consolidating and venturing into the Asia Pacific region and the global market.

The Department at present is conducting courses in two areas namely, Construction and Building Services Engineering. It is anticipated that the Wood-based Technology course would be in the offering by the year 1999. The department which started with a staff strength of 8, 60% of whom possess post-graduate qualifications, has since increased to 22 in order to cope with the 431 Diploma and Certificate course students. The 431 Diploma and Certificate course students are tutored by a team of experienced and dedicated lecturers. They also have the added advantage of hands-on experience on RM 6 million worth of equipment.

These up-to-date equipment, housed in 14 workshops and laboratories, besides being utilized for instructional purposes, can also be used for manufacturing panel products and timber components.

The Building Services Engineering Laboratory has been designed to be in line with the ever changing technology, in particular, the emergence of intelligent buildings. The air-conditioning plant, pump sets and the fire protection system in the laboratory are linked to the BAS and the card access system. This set-up, which is fast becoming a norm in the industry, is testimony of the Civil Engineering Department's strategic planning. The lighting room, solar energy systems, lift model, sophisticated testing equipment such as light meters, acoustic and vibration testers etc. all reflect the curriculum's emphasis on environmental issues.

The Civil Engineering Department, being a strong believer in skills upgrading, is continuously sending its lecturers on numerous short courses on Construction Management, CNC Woodwork and Air Conditioning, in addition to those within the obligations of equipment contract. The department takes pride in the progress made so far. The department strongly believes that as it grows in strength, its vision of producing an internationally competitive construction workforce would become a reality.

the

#### MECHANICAL engineering

department

PSA's Mechanical Engineering Department's vision is to provide the training ground for semi-professionals in the field of Mechanical Engineering and Packaging Technology courses to be competent and flexible so as to be able to respond to tomorrow's challenge today. Innovative and challenging ways of delivering the curriculum have been adopted to promote and encourage increasing intellectual independence. Flexibility in learning styles obviously needs to be facilitated by a well-equipped and flexible learning environment. All these is evident in the state-of-the-art workshops found in this department.

The total cost of equipping the workshops in this department with sophisticated and high-tech equipment is approximately RM 18.8 million. This is the largest amount spent on an individual department. Lecturers and students in this department are exposed to sophisticated softwares which include CATIA, Master CAM, Solid Work, Auto Cad, Mechanical Desktop and 3D Studio. Students are also given hands-on experience in the use of CNC milling, CNC lathe and wire cut machines. The department's facilities also include workshops and laboratories for welding, machining, moulding, packaging and CAD/CAM.

The pool of experienced academics have also been given intensive training, by the suppliers, in the operation of these machines and equipment. This training is an on-going programme to ensure lecturers are competent in operating these machines, thus facilitating the teaching-learning process,

To date, the department offers Diploma in Mechanical Engineering (General) and Certificate in Mechanical Engineering (General) courses. The total enrolment of this department is 189 students. The total student enrolment is expected to reach 1000 by the year 2000. A number of new courses namely, the Diploma in Mechanical Engineering (Packaging), Certificate in Mechanical Engineering (Packaging), Diploma in Mechanical Engineering (Manufacturing) and Certificate in Mechanical Engineering (Manufacturing) would be introduced in the middle of 1999.

Thus, it can be seen that the workshops and laboratories in PSA's Mechanical Engineering Department can be likened to a `virtual factory', offering a spectrum of activities and experience, aimed at providing students with the necessary technical competence to enable them to compete in their field of specialisation.

the

#### **ELECTRICAL** engineering

department

Today's working environment is characterized by aggressive competition and rapid changes in technology. The electronics and IT industry require high caliber professionals and sub-professionals who have the confidence and knowledge to keep abreast of the technological advances and maximise the opportunities which these new developments offer.

The Electrical Engineering Department of PSA, armed with staff who possess first and post degree qualifications are determined to play their role in helping to meet the man-power requirements of the nation by producing graduates capable of meeting the challenges ahead. The latest intake of Electrical Engineering students (July/December 1998) comprised a total of 457. It is projected that by the year 2000, the total enrolment of this department would increase to 1545, with an annual intake of approximately 600 students.

Thể department is presently conducting courses in two areas namely, Electronic Engineering (Telecommunications) and Electronics Engineering (Control) at both Certificate and Diploma Level. A new course, Electronic Engineering (Medical) at Certificate and Diploma level would commence in July 1999.

The Electrical Engineering Department has well-equipped laboratories. The telecommunications laboratory is equipped with Computer-Based Trainers (CBT) in Analogue, Digital and Fiber Optics Communication. This vast range of equipment is further enhanced by the availability of trainers in Antenna Modeling, Microwave, Satellite TV, Cellular Telephone, Fascimile, Radar and Pulse Code Switching.

The Data Communication Laboratory is equipped with workstations, complete with network system, capable of running four different operating systems. This laboratory is also equipped with an Integrated Services Digital Network (ISDN) Exchange Trainer. The trainer can be utilized to illustrate and train technicians on how voice and data and image could be transmitted simultaneously over distance. This is in tandem with the latest developments in IT.

The Instrumentation and Control Laboratory is similarly well-equipped with Process Control Plant, PLC Trainers, Servo Trainers, Transducer Trainers and an Industrial Robot Trainer. All these equipment are meant not only for instructional purposes but can also be used by industries for testing, research and development.

The Programming Laboratory is equipped with workstations and servers and is utilized solely for programming languages such as C, Pascal, Assembler and other high level languages. Besides that, this lab is also equipped with electronic work benches to carry out circuit design and to experiment electronic circuits. All the workstations are linked with a complete LAN network. Despite that, the lab has A3 size Laser plotting facility, in addition to the general purpose printing. The Programming Laboratory is also equipped with facilities for Electronic Computer Aided Design (ECAD).

This state-of-the-art computer laboratory is used for PCB design and fabrication. In addition to that, thin & thick film design can be produced using Mentorgraphics software and SUN unix workstation.

The hands-on experience given to students in the state-of-the-art workshops, the well-planned lectures and tutorials conducted in small classes are part of the Electrical Engineering Department's strategy to provide quality training to its students to enable them to face the challenges in the working world, thus helping Malaysia to achieve its vision to become a fully-industrialized nation by the year 2020.

the COMMERCE department


Globalisation, deregulation and liberalisation which ushers in a borderless world is laced with implications, particularly in the world of business. The Commerce Department views this transition seriously and is committed to giving the highest standard of education and training to enable its students to face the challenges which lie ahead.

The curriculum of all its courses, namely Certificate and Diploma in Business Studies, Diploma in Marketing, Insurance and International Trade and the soon to be introduced Diploma in Tourism Management, allows students to develop a technical understanding of marketing principles, documentation, entrepreneurship, research, investment analysis, insurance policies and international trade. Teaching methodology includes case analysis, presentation and project work. An understanding of the practical aspects of business is made possible by the mandatory six-month industrial attachment to appropriate companies in the public and private sectors and also through students' personal involvement in the organisation of activities such as Comfest (Commerce Festival). Seminars such as 'The Role of Freight Forwarder in International Business and its Involvement in Import and Export Documentation' are conducted from time to time to give students a better understanding of the subject.

The Commerce Department is fully aware that exposing its graduates to development in IT in every aspect possible will give its students the competitive edge over their peers. The department has excellent computer support facilities in its accounting laboratories and office simulation rooms.

The present enrolment of approximately 529 students have the advantage of being lectured and tutored by a team of highly educated and experienced local lecturers, 60% of whom possess a Masters Degree. The department also has voluntary lecturers form JICA (Japanese International Corporation Agency). These foreign lecturers have vast experience in the area of corporate management, international trade and investment. They also possess experience as consultants in the labour and foreign trade.

The results of the Commerce students have been most encouraging. For the January 1998 session the overall passes in the final examination was 99%. The department will continue in its efforts to produce graduates who can meet the varied demands of customers as society becomes increasingly sophisticated.



The concept of Industrial Collaboration was conceived as a result of a government policy which decreed that future skills training would be demand-driven, that is based upon demands of employers rather than labour supply. The implications of this reform is that employers will be playing a very significant role in determining the curricula.

PSA has responded to this paradigm shift by making efforts to form an Advisory Board. Invitations have been sent to CEOS/senior management staff in the public and private sectors. The response has been very favourable and the inaugural meeting is expected in early 1999. It is hoped that the mixed representation would be the start of a harmonious relationship for information exchange on issues related to the labour market, technology transfer, training needs of industries, and also the possibility of financial aid to eligible students. These information will be valuable input for curriculum design, review of existing courses, PSA's formulation of policies and developmental strategies.

In short, it is hoped that the bi-annual meeting would lay the foundation for a smart partnership between PSA, the private sector and other government agencies.

#### **ADMINISTRATION**

department

This department is PSA's first tenant as it is the first department to move into the campus. The administration department is the pulse of PSA as it provides the framework to ensure the smooth running of the whole organisation. This department plays three equally important roles. It is PSA's 'financial controller', making sure that the staff are paid on time as well as managing PSA's financial resources. This department also acts as a welfare officer, making sure that all documents related to the staff's official appointments are in order. Last, but not least, it looks into the general administration of the whole organisation.

#### **GENERAL STUDIES**

department

The department comprises three units, namely, the English Language Unit, the Islamic; Education Unit and the Moral Education Unit. The English Language Unit concentrates on providing all students with a sound command of the language, both in the oral and written skills. The three sophisticated language laboratories give ample opportunities for the students to practise their oral skills.

A Self-Access Learning Centre has also been set up with the aim of helping the students to become autonomous and independent learners. For this purpose, the English Language lecturers have been inducted to produce self-access teaching materials. In line with instilling new ideas and creativity among lecturers, a workshop on Newspaper in Education was successfully conducted by a facilitator from the New Straits Times.

The Islamic and Moral Education Units facilitate the mission of the Polytechnic in producing graduates equipped, not only with the necessary know-how to take on the challenges in the real world, but also graduates with resilient character. Towards achieving this purpose, the two units have successfully organised several activities such as Islamic Cultural Night, Weekly Islamic/Moral talks, Islamic Day and 'Aqiqah'.

#### STUDENTS AFFAIRS

department

The welfare of the students is taken care of by this department. It plans, implements and monitors all programmes involving students from the day they set foot in this campus. Interesting and varied co-curricular activities are also looked into to ensure that 'Jack and Jill will not be dull people.' Hostel a commodation is also under the jurisdiction of this department. Under the mentor-mentee system each lecturer is assigned approximately fifteen students. #### MATHEMATICS, SCIENCE & COMPUTER

department

This department is responsible for providing computing service to the citizens of PSA. The mission of the department is to provide quality facilities and training programmes to increase computing competency of both the staff and students of PSA as well as for the public. This department envisages to be an excellent centre for computing education and training, while at the some time, being the channel for the latest innovations in the field of Infomation Technology.

There are five laboratories each with 45 Pentium - based multimedia computers, multimedia capable, running under Windows NT 4.0 network operating systems.

An innovation Centre, 'The Link' serves as a centre for the staff to equip themselves with the latest developments in Information Technology through self-directed learning, and tutorials on a one - to - one coaching basis. Tailor-made courses are also available. The knowledge gained will form the basis for the development of instructional materials.

This department can be likened to a bridge that connects Politeknik Shah Alam to the world of work. TACED has been entrusted with the responsibility of managing training programmes for its 147 staff; 114 in the management and professional category and the remaining 33 in the support category.

It also supervises students' industrial placement as well as liase with the public and private sectors under the banner of Time-Sector Privatisation (TSP). The TSP programme represents a smart partnership where outside agencies can utilize the polytechnic's existing facilities and expertise. PSA's lecturer's could also be attached to these agencies for a limited period to enable them to be up-dated in the practical aspects of the requirements of the job market.

This department is also the 'public relations department' of PSA. TACED hopes to advertise, publicise and promote PSA to outside agencies via publication of its monthly bulletin and the Annual Report plus taking part in joint exhibitions.

**Students Activities** 

The Career Guidance Unit is one of the nine existing units of the Students Affairs Department. Its main function is to provide an avenue for accessing information concerning their future careers through talks, seminars, visits to the industries and participation in exhibitions. It also looks into the academic as well as holistic development of the students. A peer group guidance programme in which selected students were given training in peer group counselling was initiated in July 1998. The short - term objective of this programme is to promote group learning via a system in which a group leader has a maximum of ten students under his/her `wings'. Desired values are instilled into students through participation in programmes such as the 'Child Adoption Programme' involving the residents of Kampung Endah, Banting. Other activities which are regular items on the agenda are talks / seminars / workshops on motivation, time management, leadership and study skills by professional speakers and motivators.

# Students' Representatives Council of PSA

The Students' Representative Council or Jawatankuasa Perwakilan Pelajar (JPP) of Politeknik Shah Alam, on the advice of appointed lecturers, is responsible for organising religious, sports, welfare and social activities as well as society and club activities for the students.

To date, JPP has caried out the following activities:

- 1. participating in academic exhibitions
- 2. leasing out stalls during PSA Co-Curriculum Day
- 3. organising the Students' Annual Dinner
- 4. providing students with a parking lot
- 5. providing transportation facilities for non-hostelites
- launching the One-Cent Campaign'
- 7. publishing the students bulletin

In conclusion, JPP acts as a link between the administration and the students, initiating appropriate clubs and societies whose membership are open to the students, thereby playing a very crucial role in the all-rounded personality development of the students.

#### Co-Curriculum Unit

The co-curriculum unit of PSA was established in July 1997 when the first intake of students enrolled. The main objectives of this unit are to enable students to cultivate team spirit and inculcate self discipline. Involvement of students in co-curriculur activities will allow students to develop leadership skills and learn the values of co-operation and tolerance with their peers and the community. The co-curriculum unit provides a platform for students to develop further their talents and interests by participating in all the activities available.

Today, 12 societies/clubs come under the co-curriculum unit. They are as follows:










Mentor-mentee is a programme where lecturers are assigned students as their adopted sisters or brothers. Every lecturer, including the Principal, has about 15 to 20 mentees under his/her supervision. This system is part of PSA's efforts to provide a caring and loving environment, where students can have `a shoulder to cry on' if the need arises. Statistics valid till December 1998, mentees were supervised by 112 mentors from nine different departments in PSA. Among the activities carried out during the mentor-mentee meetings are birthday celebrations, recreational activities such as picnics and visits.



KORSA BHD was incorporated on July 30, 1997. It has 1,732 members comprising staff and students of PSA. KOPSA is managed by 15 board of directors, 11 lecturers and 4 students. KOPSA's one year operation has received positive response from all staff and students alike. KOPSA BHD. has shown good progress in terms of sales and shop management. Currently, KOPSA BHD. is running a co-operative store selling students basic necessities. It is also responsible for the purchase and distribution of orientation week's items such as batik dresses, track suits, caps and T-shirts. KOPSA BHD. contributes to PSA's activities by giving donations in terms of goods and money.

#### HOSTEL

The three hostels - two for the male students and one for the female students - can accommodate up to 1272 students at any one time. The facilities include a spacious study area, a recreational area equipped with a TV, a laundrette and a cafeteria. Besides providing a conducive environment, various activities are organised to foster closer ties among the hostelites.



PSA's Entrepreneur Club which was formed in October 1997, with the objective of providing guidance and exposure in entrepreneurship, was officially launched and incorporated on August 6, 1998. The principal of PSA is the Registrar of the Company. The initial 75 members has since increased to 266 todate. Income for the club is generated through membership subscription and an additional fund amounting to RM20,000 was received from the Ministry of Entrepreneur Development.

Students who sit on the Board, manage the affairs of the club.with the guidance of their lecturers. Businesses are either run solely by the club or on a joint venture basis. The 6 businesses currently in operation are The Trillion Entertainment Centre (rental of Audio-Visuals), laundry services, hair cut services, the photocopier & binding services, the car wash and photo studio services. It was also involved in catering food during Orientation Week. The club was the co-ordinator for the Convocation of all kindergartens under KEMAS (Subang Jaya). The club has plans to diversify into nursery and fishery related projects.

#### LIBRARY

The Politeknik Shah Alam library was officially opened by the principal, Tuan Hj. Yusoff b. Harun on October 12, 1998. The library can accommodate up to 706 students and lecturers at any one time. To date, membership is restricted to students and staff of Politeknik Shah Alam. Approximately RM 1.2 million has been spent on reading materials which covers a wide range of topics on Engineering, Commerce, Accountancy, Religious Studies, Mathematics, English, Education and Sports. There are plans to set up cybernet kiosks in the library so that users can access the Internet.

# THE ISLAMIC CENTRE

This centre works closely with the Islamic Education unit to instill values into the students. The centre now conducts the weekly Friday prayers for the polytechnic community. Members of the public have also graced these Friday prayers. The teaching of the Quran is held every day at the centre.

#### MONTHLY

#### ASSEMBLY

PSA's monthly assembly was conceived with the aim of promoting an effective two-way communication between top-level management and staff at grass-root levels. It is here that the CEO of PSA shares his thoughts and plans for PSA with all his staff. These monthly assemblies also provide an avenue for staff of various departments to be acquainted with one another. Joyous occasions such as weddings, the birth of a new baby and birthdays are celebrated during these assemblies as part of PSA's on-going efforts to inculcate the spirit of sharing and caring among its staff. Fourteen monthly assemblies, hosted by different departments on a rotation basis, have been held to date.


#### DEVELOPMENT

PSA firmly believes that human resource development is an integral part of an organisation's strategic planning towards achieving its objectives. Comprehensive staff development programmes are carried out to ensure the best available human resource to staff its organisation. Here, at PSA every opportunity is given to its staff to update and upgrade themselves. Staff's areas of interests are identified through a Needs Analysis and this is monitored yearly. All new staff are orientated into the new environment via an induction and TQM course where the CEO of PSA provides an insight into the organisation's vision and mission. Numerous courses in the fields of management, electronics and computers have been made available to PSA's staff through concerted efforts between the Technical Education Division of the Ministry of Education and institutions such as IAB (Institut Aminuddin Baki), ITTHO (Institut Teknologi Tun Hussein Onn) and INTAN (Institut Tadbir Awam Negara). A number of technical courses, sponsored by the Colombo Plan Staff College, SEAMEO-VOTEC, the Japanese and Singapore government are also available for the staff of PSA. It is evident that PSA is committed in its efforts to provide every opportunity to its staff to better themselves at all times through internal, external as well as overseas courses.






